7. ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATE

Move-in date for the new administrative spaces has been pushed back to early November due to delays in shipping of electrical components. Completion of the entire project is projected for February. ASA Prindle is working on a lease agreement with Lombard Vet for the boarding of shelter dogs while the kennel area is being renovated.

Animal Services is currently caring for under 200 animals. 40 animals were adopted during the one day Clear the Shelters event. The Chicagoland Humane Coalition is hosting Super Adoption Saturday on September 28th at the Lake County Fairgrounds. More than 22 shelters and rescues will be participating. Animal Services will be showcasing small animals, cats and kittens. The Super Adoption Saturday goal is to have 500 animals adopted during the event.

Laura thanked DAF donors and board for making it possible to provide urgent and specialty medical assistance for the recent influx of animals with severe medical issues. She reminded the committee that DAF is critical to making sure that Animal Services doesn't have to question whether an animal can receive the care and treatment they need.

9. NEW BUSINESS

9.A. Discussion: Animal Services Community Room Event Space Rental

Chair Krajewski shared that ASA McCarthy has been doing research on the requirements and restrictions related to renting out the new Animal Services multi-purpose room to outside groups for special events.

Among the topics to be addressed:

- Is the committee in favor of renting the space for special events
- Is the committee in favor of allowing food & beverage into the space
- Is the committee in favor of allowing alcohol to be served in the space
- Who will be allowed to serve food and alcohol in the space
- What are the minimum insurance requirements for the above
- Proposed ordinance, fee schedule, and policy for rental of the space

Once these topics are addressed and details drafted, it will then be presented to the full County Board for review and approval.

Chair Krajewski asked for a consensus from the committee. All committee members were in favor of allowing the space to be rented. All committee members were also in favor of food, beverage, and alcohol being served in the space.

4. CHAIRMAN'S REMARKS - CHAIR KRAJEWSKI

Chair Krajewski remarked that Laura will be presenting the FY2025 Animal Services budget at today's meeting. The budget includes a proposed increase in rabies registration tag fees. The budget also reflects a plan to increase headcount in order to meet the needs of the new shelter and increased veterinary services for Animal Services and the public.

Chair Krajewski shared that in light of several municipalities directing their stray animal holding to Animal Services due to service fee increases on the part of their current stray holding facilities, we will be reviewing our municipal stray holding fee structure to ensure that we are covering the cost of caring for the increasing number of animals coming from our municipal partners. The current fee structure is not sustainable.

8. FY2025 ANIMAL SERVICES BUDGET PRESENTATION

Laura presented the FY25 Animal Services budget to the committee. FY25 budget detail and performance indicators can be found on the DuPage County website at: <u>Animal Services (1300)</u> (opengov.com) https://stories.opengov.com/dupageil/published/h1bj5xR92pL

Key takeaways:

- -Animal intake increased in 2023 to 2,155
- -Live Release Rate increased to 92%
- -Community Services increased:
 - 600+ non-shelter animals treated
 - 379 free spay/neuter/vaccine microchip vouchers issued
 - 110 education programs conducted
- -Fee adjustments are being proposed for rabies tag registration fees to support increased cost of operating in the new shelter. Registration fees have not changed since 2018.
- -The community and education spaces in the new shelter will provide several opportunities for new revenue starting in FY25 including expanded educational opportunities, corporate and community rental opportunities, etc.
- -The FY25 budget includes the final invoices for the Phase II capital improvement project.
- -The FY25 budget does not include a \$50,000 unrestricted gift from DuPage Animal Friends as DAF fundraising efforts are directed to the capital campaign. As a result, there is an increase to the Medical Services line in the FY25 Animal Services budget.

9. ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATE

October is the move-in date for the new administrative spaces. Completion of the entire project is projected for January. Dr. Ludwig and Lombard Veterinary Hospital have graciously extended the use of their kennels for off-site boarding of DCAS dogs while our kennel areas are being renovated. She is also donating cat cages and a wet surgical table to DCAS.

Staff are currently caring for over 200 animals.

ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION FOR THE ANIMAL SERVICES FUND COMPANY 1100 - ACCOUNTING UNIT 1300 \$4,500,000

WHEREAS, appropriations for the ANIMAL SERVICES FUND for Fiscal Year 2024 were adopted by the County Board pursuant to Ordinance FI-O-0009-23; and

WHEREAS, due to Animal Services expanding the scope of its renovation and addition to the existing facility, there is a need for an additional appropriation in the ANIMAL SERVICES FUND, COMPANY 1100 - ACCOUNTING UNIT 1300, in the amount of \$4,500,000 (FOUR MILLION, FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND, AND NO/100 DOLLARS); and

WHEREAS, there is sufficient unappropriated cash in the ANIMAL SERVICES FUND, COMPANY 1100 - ACCOUNTING UNIT 1300, to support an additional appropriation of \$4,500,000 (FOUR MILLION, FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND, AND NO/100 DOLLARS); and

WHEREAS, the need to provide an additional appropriation in the amount of \$4,500,000 (FOUR MILLION, FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND, AND NO/100 DOLLARS); in the ANIMAL SERVICES FUND, COMPANY 1100 - ACCOUNTING UNIT 1300, creates an emergency within the meaning of the Counties Act, Budget Division, (55 ILCS 5/6-1003).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the DuPage County Board that an additional appropriation (Attachment) in the amount of \$4,500,000 (FOUR MILLION, FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND, AND NO/100 DOLLARS); in the ANIMAL SERVICES FUND, COMPANY 1100 - ACCOUNTING UNIT 1300, is hereby approved and added to the Fiscal Year 2024 Appropriation Ordinance.
