Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery Program (CDBG-DR)



- HUD provides flexible grants to help cities, counties, and States recover from Presidentially declared disasters, subject to availability of supplemental appropriations.
- In response to Presidentially declared disasters, Congress may appropriate additional funding for the CDBG Program as Disaster Recovery grants to rebuild affected areas and provide crucial funding to start the recovery process.
- CDBG Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) assistance funds a broad range of recovery activities to help communities and neighborhoods that might not otherwise recover due to limited resources.



Flood Event


- Occurred on April 18, 2013
- Widespread flooding throughout the County
- Homes destroyed, businesses disrupted, and public safety affected throughout the County
- Presidentially declared disaster, County received three CDBG-DR appropriations
- A total of \$31,526,000 received for disaster recovery and long-term planning
- All projects are complete
- Grant closeout underway





After the Flood Event

- Damage Assessments
- Determined Stakeholders
- Established Partnerships
- Public Outreach
- Established Budget
- Released NOFA for Eligible Projects
- Application Review
- Allocated Funds





Activities

DuPage County Stormwater Department Partnership

- Buy-out opportunity through the established DuPage County buy-out program
- Watershed plans utilized and flood related infrastructure improvements were selected

Municipal Projects

- Applications accepted for:
 - Infrastructure projects linked to the 2013 event
 - Housing buy-out options for residential structures impacted by 2013 event

Stormwater Collaboration

Armstrong Park Detention Facility

- \$9.6 million project cost, with \$9.4 million in CDBG-DR funding
- Partnership established with DuPage County Stormwater Department
- Designed to limit pollutants back into Klein Creek and reduce local flooding
- Two Reservoir System Completed
- Over ½ mile of underground piping linking back to Klein Creek





Buyout & Demolition

- Over 40 residential properties acquired within 9 municipalities throughout DuPage County
- Homes demolished and converted into open space
- Funds leveraged through FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)





Infrastructure Improvement

Village of Bensenville, Illinois Culvert Replacement Project

- \$200,000 project cost, with \$160,000 in CDBG-DR funding
- Partnership established with local municipal government
- Designed to limit flooding downstream





Summary

- \$31,526,000 allocated to DuPage County
- An additional \$7,270,913 leveraged from projects
- Over 60% Low- & Moderate-Income Benefit
- Over 53,000 linear miles of public improvements (i.e., storm sewer improvements, water main improvements, combined storm/sanitary sewer separation)
- 13 public facilities improved (i.e., culvert replacements, floodplain enhancements, river restoration, water retention/detention facilities, etc.)
- Infrastructure improvements completed throughout 10 municipalities
- Over 40 buyouts of flood prone single-family properties throughout 9 municipalities, each restored to natural floodplain
- Over 50,000 residents were impacted by the improvements.
