Member Zay asked for an update on the O'Hare project and John Loper advised the Committee that he has sent a meeting request to review the project to the Chicago Department of Aviation, and is awaiting their response.

Member Zay mentioned some concerns about electric bikes and scooters on the trails traveling at a high rate of speed. He inquired as to the possibility of a speed ordinance. Deputy Chief Assistant State's Attorney Barbara Reynolds explained that the current statute allows the County to ban all E-bikes or disallow a class of E-bikes, (class 3 is the fastest), and since the County is not home rule, it does not have any additional authority such as setting speed limits. Discussion was held.

Action Requested - Identify the action to be taken and the total cost; for instance, approval of new contract, renew contract, increase contract, etc.

The County has determined that the contract issued to Knight E/A, Inc. for Professional Phase II Design Engineering Services for the CH 21 / Fabyan Parkway from IL 38 to County Line requires additional work beyond the original scope of the project resulting in an increase to the contract in the amount of \$76,405.80.

Increase the upper limit of the contract by \$76,405.80.

Summary Explanation/Background - Provide an executive summary of the action. Explain why it is necessary and what is to be accomplished.

The Fabyan Parkway - IL 38 to County Line project is progressing through Phase II engineering. During the environmental coordination of the project, IDOT instituted work restrictions on part of the project site due to proximity to a detention pond used by a threatened and endangered common gallinule. This restriction requires major changes to the maintenance of traffic plans, which was not expected by Knight E/A. Additionally, during the course of the land acquisition process, the property owner requested impacts to their business sign and retaining walls be avoided. This work requires a redesign of the proposed curb line and storm sewer and changes to the proposed plans, which was also not expected by Knight E/A. All of this work is not included in the original scope of the contract.

Original Source Selection/Vetting Information - Describe method used to select source.

The DOT only selects firms that are pre-qualified in accordance with IDOT guidelines. Requests for Statements of Interest were sent to firms throughout the industry. Statements of Interest were received from 24 firms. Based on the review of the Statements of Interest, 3 firms were shortlisted and requested to submit a Statement of Qualification. The DOT reviewed each submittal taking into consideration the qualifications of the firm and understanding key issues of the project, experience of the firm and key personnel on similar projects, and any strategies to ensure timely completion of the phase I updated and design phase are met. Based on a comprehensive review of the submittals, the DOT determined that the project team assembled by Knight E/A, Inc. was most qualified and had the staff available to perform the work on behalf of the County.

Recommendations/Alternatives - Describe staff recommendation and provide justification. Identify at least 2 other options to accomplish this request.

- 1. Supplement the contract to Knight E/A, Inc. This is the recommended option.
- 2. Contract with another firm. Not recommended due to staff's determination that Knight E/A, Inc. is the most qualified to perform this work and has been awarded a design engineering contract for this work.
- 3. Do not supplement the current contract. Not recommended as the DOT does not posses the staff resources or the technology to perform this work and must contract for these services.

Fiscal Impact/Cost Summary - Include projected cost for each fiscal year, approved budget amount and account number, source of funds, and any future funding requirements along with any narrative.

The FY24 fiscal impact for this supplement is anticipated to be \$76,405.80. The DOT has sufficient funds to account for this increase.

Scope of Work, Deliverables and Schedule Fabyan Parkway (CH 21) from IL 38 to County Line Section 08-00210-03-FP June 27, 2024 Page 1 of 3

SCOPE OF WORK

Proposed improvements to Fabyan Parkway (CH 21) from IL 38 to the County Line, Section 08-00210-03-FP, are anticipated to include two 12-foot thru lanes in each direction separated by an 18-foot barrier median, with dual left turn lanes and a right turn lane in both directions at the intersection of Fabyan Parkway and Technology Boulevard. Additional scope includes a multi-use path on the south side of Fabyan Parkway between Technology Boulevard and McChesney Road, a combination of open and closed drainage, and the replacement of the double box culvert at Kress Creek.

The proposed limits of construction will extend from approximately eight hundred feet west of IL 38 to the DuPage/Kane County line. The limits of improvement measure approximately 8,000 feet.

During the development of the Phase II plans, after the preliminary submittal, a letter from the National Resource Review (NRR) was received. The letter dated, June 15, 2023, stated that no construction could occur "along Fabyan Parkway on both the north and south sides of Fabyan Parkway starting 200 feet west of detention pond SF-10 west boundary to 200 feet east of SF-10 east boundary from April 15th through August 31st of any construction year." This change required conceptual redesign of the maintenance of traffic plan in order to accommodate this change. This requirement was ultimately revised (see next paragraph), however conceptual effort was made to accommodate this change.

A revised NRR letter dated July 26, 2023 was received which revised the construction limitations to "avoid all work on and along Fabyan Parkway beyond 50 feet north of the centerline of Fabyan Parkway, from Station 96+00 to Station 111+00 from April 15th through August 31st of any construction year. Staging and vehicle parking shall not occur in this area during April 15th through August 31st of any construction year." This change required a new approach to staging the construction and plans had to be revised a second time.

During the development of the Phase II plans, the Jurisdictional Determination expired and requires resubmitting and/or engineers opinion. Knight will coordinate with the ACOE to determine how to proceed. A new JD submittal or an engineers opinion will be required to proceed.

During the development of Phase II plans, DuPage County requested the temporary easements and proposed right of way be evaluated to limit the amount of property takes at multiple locations. Knight will analyze these locations and provide revised proposed right of way and temporary easements where appropriate.

During the development of Phase II plans, DuPage County requested Knight to analyze the Fabyan Boulevard and Technology Boulevard intersection geometry to determine if modifications to the geometry could avoid impacts to the DuPage County Technology Park signage and retaining walls. Upon determining it was possible to redesign the intersection geometry, plans and quantities were updated to reflect the geometric revisions.

Knight proposes to perform the following supplemental Phase II Engineering services. These services are in addition to the services provided in the original agreement dated May 10, 2020. The attached Workhour Estimate and CECS provide additional detailed information in a similar order as provided below.



Phase II Plan Development

A detailed workhour estimate for "Phase II Plan Development and Other Phase II PS&E Tasks" is included herein that provides brief remarks for any contract documents affected by the NRR letter revisions and other tasks.

The Supplemental Phase II scope will include preparation of engineering plans, specifications and estimates for the following task related to the two NRR letters received.

- 1) Conceptual change due to first NRR letter received
 - a. Meetings with Construction staff to discuss means and methods
 - b. Initial drafting of conceptual plans
- 2) Conceptual change due to second NRR letter
 - a. Meeting with Construction staff to discuss means and methods
 - b. Initial drafting of conceptual models
 - c. General notes, typical sections, plan sheet revisions, and details for the new MOT concept

Deliverables: Revised MOT plans in conformance with the second NRR letter's restrictions on construction.

Design, Permitting and Coordination

Jurisdictional Wetland Determination: The approved wetland jurisdictional determination (JD) for this project area, issued on March 16th, 2021, is no longer valid. Knight will coordinate with the Army Corp of Engineers (ACOE) with determining procedures going forward up to and including a new JD submittal if required. In the event that a new JD is not required, Knight environmental staff will give their professional opinion on the JD status of the wetlands which will allow the design to proceed.

Deliverables: Knight will provide its professional opinion on the jurisdictional status of the wetland sites on the project.

NWP 14 Pre-construction Notification: Knight will prepare a pre-construction notification (PCN) to submit to the ACOE as require under Nationwide Permit 14 for impacts to jurisdictional waters of the U.S. The PCN will include wetlands and waterbodies assumed to be jurisdictional based on Knight environmental staff's professional opinion and coordination with the ACOE. The PCN will quantify jurisdictional wetland impacts and request authorization for those impacts under NWP 14.

Deliverables: Knight will submit a PCN for the Project to the ACOE requesting authorization under NWP 14.

Proposed R.O.W. and Easements: Knight was asked to investigate the proposed right of way and temporary easements at the following locations for the potential of reducing the take areas of the following parcels:

Parcel 0004

Station 55+00 to 57+00, south proposed right of way Station 57+00 to 63+75, south proposed right of way and temporary easement

Knight will investigate the need for the right of way and easements and make adjustments to the plans for areas taken to reduce the total take where appropriate. Updated plats and legals will be provided by American Surveying and Engineering utilizing existing budget.

Deliverable: Revised plans showing the new right of way and easements. Updated signed plat and legal (by ASE).

Revisions to Fabyan/Technology Boulevard Intersection Geometry: Knight will investigate the potential to revise the intersection geometry to allow for 5 feet of clear space between the existing signs and retaining walls and still allow for all design vehicle turning movements. Work will include revising the curbline geometry, preparing auto-turn exhibits, revising roadway, drainage, traffic signal, MOT, pavement marking, erosion control, seeding, and cross section plans and the associated quantities. Specifications will be reviewed and updated to reflect any changes as necessary. This work will be incorporated into an updated Pre-Final submittal to be reviewed by DuPage County.

Deliverables: Updated plans, specifications, and quantities reflecting the changes made to the intersection as described above.

As-Needed

As-Needed work is provided for future out of scope work. This work shall require prior authorization by DuPage County before being used.

BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF DU PAGE AND ARG DCDARIL001 LLC

FOR TRAFFIC SIGNALS

AT CH 33/75TH STREET AND LYMAN AVENUE AND AT CH 33/75TH STREET AND FAIRMOUNT AVENUE

This Agreement (hereinafter referred to as "AGREEMENT") is executed this _____ day of ______, 2024, between the County of DuPage (hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY"), a body corporate and politic, with offices at 421 North County Farm Road, Wheaton, Illinois and ARG DCDARIL001, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company (hereinafter referred to as "ARG"), with offices c/o Global Net Lease, 650 5th Avenue, 30th Floor, New York, New York 10019.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and RPAI Darien LLC ("RPAI"), ARG's predecessor-in-interest, previously entered into an agreement (hereinafter referred to as the "PREVIOUS AGREEMENT") executed December 10, 2013, for the maintenance and energy responsibilities for a traffic signal on CH 33/75th Street at Lyman Avenue (hereinafter referred to as the "LYMAN SIGNAL") and a traffic signal at CH 33/75th Street at Fairmount Avenue (hereinafter referred to as the "FAIRMOUNT SIGNAL" and collectively hereinafter referred to as the "SIGNALS"); and

WHEREAS, the PREVIOUS AGREEMENT expired on February 24, 2022, when RPAI sold a substantial portion of the real estate property known as Darien Towne Centre, located at 2189 75th Street, Darien, Illinois, (the "PROPERTY"), legally described on Exhibit A, (attached hereto and incorporated herein), to ARG; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY and ARG, as successor owner of the PROPERTY have determined that it is in each's mutual best interest to enter into a new agreement for the continued maintenance and energy responsibilities and/or future modernization/reconstruction costs of said SIGNALS; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY by virtue of its power set forth in "Counties Code" (55 ILCS 5/5-1001 et seq.) and "Illinois Highway Code" (605 ILCS 5/5-101 et seq.), is authorized to enter into this AGREEMENT.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises, the mutual covenants, terms, and conditions herein set forth, and the understandings of each party to the other, the parties do hereby mutually covenant, promise and agree as follows:

1.0 INCORPORATION

- 1.1. All recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and made part thereof, the same constituting the factual basis for this AGREEMENT.
- 1.2. The headings of the paragraphs and subparagraphs of this AGREEMENT are the inserts for convenience of reference only and shall not be deemed to constitute part of this AGREEMENT or to affect the construction hereof.

2.0 EFFECTIVE DATE

- 2.1. As of the date of sale of the PROPERTY, February 24, 2022, the PREVIOUS AGREEMENT became null and void in its entirety between the COUNTY and RPAI.
- 2.2 This AGREEMENT is effective once executed by both parties.

3.0 RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE COUNTY

- 3.1. The COUNTY shall provide and pay for all costs associated with the maintenance of the LYMAN SIGNAL and the FAIRMOUNT SIGNAL with <u>reimbursement</u> of the FAIRMOUNT SIGNAL maintenance costs by ARG as outlined hereinafter.
- 3.2. The COUNTY retains the right to control and regulate the sequence and all other aspects of phasing and timing of the SIGNALS.
- 3.3. The COUNTY shall remain responsible for all pavement markings concerning the SIGNALS except as outlined hereinafter.

4.0 RESPONSIBILITIES OF ARG

4.1. ARG shall pay all energy costs and shall be invoiced directly by the energy provider for the SIGNALS.

- 4.2. ARG shall reimburse the COUNTY for the routine maintenance costs including pre-emption equipment, etc. for the FAIRMOUNT SIGNAL by annual invoice from the COUNTY. Routine maintenance shall be invoiced to ARG at the same unit price paid by the COUNTY for the COUNTY Traffic Signal Maintenance Contract in place at the time of the annual invoice.
- 4.3. ARG agrees that non-payment of invoice(s) from the COUNTY related to the FAIRMOUNT SIGNAL within forty-five (45) days of the date of invoice shall be considered reason to remove said FAIRMOUNT SIGNAL, provided that at least sixty (60) days prior to the removal of the FAIRMOUNT SIGNAL, the COUNTY shall give written notice to ARG of the date certain of removal. Costs incurred by COUNTY to remove the FAIRMOUNT SIGNAL shall be 100% reimbursement by ARG. The date that such notice is mailed out by the COUNTY constitutes the date of service to ARG.
- 4.4. ARG agrees that the COUNTY shall repair damages to the SIGNALS caused by motor vehicles or construction activities by others and shall invoice ARG for all said costs not recovered by the COUNTY. COUNTY agrees to execute any necessary documentation subrogating COUNTY's rights to ARG for recovery of said cost.
- 4.5. ARG shall maintain all pavement markings on the approach to the intersection from ARG's entrance (south leg) of Fairmount Avenue for the FAIRMOUNT SIGNAL.

5.0 FUTURE MODERNIZATION/RECONSTRUCTION

5.1 If, in the future, it is determined that the FAIRMOUNT SIGNAL requires modernization or reconstruction due to age, condition, etc. or if the COUNTY improves CH 33/75th Street which results in the need to modernize or reconstruct the FAIRMOUNT SIGNAL, the COUNTY shall notify ARG at least three (3) months prior to the improvement to allow ARG to review the cost proposal and budget for the cost. ARG shall have the option to either have the FAIRMOUNT SIGNAL removed at the time of the improvement or pay the cost to upgrade the FAIRMOUNT SIGNAL. All costs, either for the removal of the FAIRMOUNT SIGNAL or the upgrade cost shall be paid by ARG within forty-five (45) days from receipt of a documented invoice from the COUNTY.

6.0 INDEMNIFICATION

- 6.1. The COUNTY shall, to the extent permitted by law, indemnify, hold harmless and defend ARG, its officials, officers, employees, and agents from and against all liability, claims, suits, demands, proceedings and action, including costs, fees and expense of defense, arising from, growing out of, or related to, any loss, damage, injury, death, or loss or damage to property resulting from, or connected with, the COUNTY's negligent or willful acts, errors or omissions in its performance under this AGREEMENT to the extent permitted by law.
 - 6.1.1. The COUNTY and ARG acknowledge that the COUNTY has made no representations, assurances or guaranties regarding the COUNTY'S or any successor's or assign's authority and legal capacity to indemnify ARG as provided for in this AGREEMENT. In the event a court of competent jurisdiction holds that the COUNTY, or any successor or assign, is deemed to lack the lawful authority or ability to indemnify, defend or hold harmless ARG, or any person or entity claiming a right through ARG, or in the event of change in the laws of the State of Illinois governing the COUNTY's or any successor's or assign's indemnification authority, occurrence(s) shall not affect the validity and enforceability of the remainder of this AGREEMENT or the parties rights and obligations provided for therein.
- 6.2. ARG shall indemnify, hold harmless and defend the COUNTY, its officials, officers, employees, and agents from and against all liability, claims, suits, demands, proceedings and action, including reasonable costs, fees and expense of defense, arising from, growing out of, or related to, any loss, damage, injury, death, or loss or damage to property resulting from, or connected with, ARG's negligent or willful acts, errors or omissions in its performance under this AGREEMENT to the extent permitted by law. ARG does not hereby waive any defenses or immunity available to it with respect to third parties.

6.3. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as prohibiting the COUNTY, its officials, directors, officers, agents and employees, from defending through the selection and use of their own agents, attorneys and experts, any claims, suits, demands, proceedings and

actions brought against them. Pursuant to Illinois law, 55 ILCS 5/3-9005, any attorney representing the COUNTY, under this paragraph or paragraph 6.1, who is not already an Assistant State's Attorney, is to be appointed a Special Assistant State's Attorney, as provided in 55 ILCS 5/3-9008. The COUNTY's participation in its defense shall not remove ARG's duty to indemnify, defend, and hold the COUNTY harmless, as set forth above.

- 6.4. The COUNTY does not waive, by these indemnity requirements, any defenses or protections under the Local Governmental and Governmental Employees Tort Immunity Act (745 ILCS 10/1 et seq.) or otherwise available to it, or ARG, under the law.
- 6.5. Any indemnity as provided in this AGREEMENT shall not be limited by reason of the enumeration of any insurance coverage herein provided.

7.0 ENTIRE AGREEMENT

7.1. This AGREEMENT represents the entire AGREEMENT between the parties with respect to the SIGNALS and supersedes all previous communications or understandings whether oral or written.

8.0 NOTICES

8.1.
