9. ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATE

Laura thanked Dr. Tvrdik and Dr. Susan Brown for stepping up to provide relief vet services while DCAS was seeking a new veterinarian.

Dr. Tvrdik provided a brief history of her education and background.

Laura and Dr. Tvrdik have been regularly discussing protocols and updates surrounding Avian Flu while keeping an eye on the cat population coming in from the outdoors. Information has been shared with the veterinary community, posted on social media and included in the Animal Services e-newsletter to educate various audiences on the signs, prevention and response to Avian Flu.

Laura shared that coyote calls are expectedly on the rise as it is coyote mating season. Residents are advised to not leave pets unattended and to adopt hazing techniques to deter coyotes.

Animal population is currently under 100 animals. Staff continue to maintain a lower animal population - especially for dogs - while kennel areas are being renovated. Construction is still on track to be substantially completed by the end of February. Laura praised the Facilities Management team for their expertise with facilitating design and informing her of ways in which to adjust operations to keep construction on track.

2024 intake/outcome data is being collected. Laura will have current Live Release Rate figures to share at the February meeting.

Laura offered assistance to any committee member(s) interested in having her or Jillian accompany them to meetings with prospective gala sponsors. Please send names and contact information to Laura or Jillian.

10. OLD BUSINESS

Chair Krajewski questioned whether Animal Services has been utilizing all collected Pet Population Funds for the low income spay/neuter voucher program. Laura confirmed that yes, all PPF revenue is exhausted at the end of each year. She added that annual PPF program expenses far exceed PPF revenue with the difference off-set by the Animal Services operating budget each year. Laura shared that DuPage County's program funds 100% of the spay/neuter, vaccines and microchipping for each participant in the spirit of reducing pet overpopulation and preventing intake, something that sets DuPage County apart from other counties.

Chair Krajewski requested additional municipal training on services available to municipalities and animal response best practices. Laura confirmed that municipal training is returning this year with content tailored to resources and field response at the local level. This training will be open to all municipalities and Forest Preserve rangers.

Member Rutledge asked for an update on Animal Services multipurpose room rental. Laura will have a price list available for the February meeting. Chair Krajewski asked ASA Prindle to provide direction on whether or not food/beverage/liquor can be offered and any permits/licenses required.

9. ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATE

Animal population is currently 138 animals. The shelter is experiencing longer lengths of stay (LOS) for small animals with guinea pig LOS currently at 90 days and rabbit LOS at 74 days. LOS for dogs and cats is currently around 45 days.

Animal adoption fees are currently 50% off. Senior pets that are adopted receive one month of free pet food.

Staff, cats, and small animals will begin moving into their permanent locations in the new shelter addition beginning on Monday, November 25th. The shelter will be closed to the public from November 25th - November 29th. The shelter will reopen to the public from the new Manchester entrance on Saturday, November 30th. Public communications will be sent via email and social media. Due to issues with arranging off-site boarding, dogs will remain on-site for the remainder of the project. Animal Services is continuing to ask that shelter/rescue partners continue to assist with accepting owner surrendered pets so that Animal Services can focus on maintaining space available for stray animals.

Intake diversion strategies have so far been successful. YTD January - November 18th intake is 1,713 compared to 2,047 intakes the same period last year.

Bite cases are down 7% over this time last year. Dangerous dog cases are also down. Laura attributed this to the public outreach and education on bite prevention and safety around animals that Animal Services is actively doing with the public, as well as 1:1 counseling with owners of animals involved in bites to prevent reoccurrence.

Laura fielded questions pertaining to animal bites and dangerous/vicious declarations. Severity of the bite, the degree to which it was or was not difficult to separate the offending animal from

the victim, whether the bite was provoked or unprovoked, the environment the bite took place in, are some of the many factors that go into determining whether or not an animal is declared dangerous. Per state law, an animal must be declared dangerous three times before a vicious dog investigation can be opened; with the vicious dog investigation opened up simultaneously with the third dangerous investigation.

Laura addressed questions regarding the increase in owner surrendered animals. Owner surrender requests are on the rise across the country. The increase can mostly be attributed to the increase in cost of living, the increase in veterinary care costs and the lack of affordable vet care, the lack of pet-friendly housing, landlord breed restrictions, and expensive pet deposits for renters with pets. The hope once construction is completed is to hire a second staff veterinarian and to offer affordable veterinary wellness services to the public in areas that are not already being serviced.

Laura recommended that everyone subscribe to and follow both Animal Services and DuPage Animal Friends on social media and email to receive all the latest event details and information.

Limitations on the Authority of the County of DuPage to Contract

The County of DuPage ("County") is a non-home rule unit of local government under the Constitution and laws of the State of Illinois. Pursuant to Section 7 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution of 1970, counties and municipalities which are not home rule units have only the powers granted to them by law and the powers set forth in the state constitution. Accordingly, and unlike Cook County and many of Illinois's larger municipalities, every action DuPage County takes must be tied to a specific constitutional or statutory grant of authority or be necessarily inferred from that specifically granted authority. Any action the County takes in excess of that authority is ultra vires and void ab initio as a matter of law.

During the course of the procurement process, vendors frequently provide standard form contracts or propose exceptions that contain terms which, though commercially reasonable in a particular industry, are outside of the County's authority to agree to. The most common areas of conflict involve proposed provisions that require the County to provide a vendor with an indemnity, exclude the state's attorney's participation in the selection and control of outside counsel, or provide for more aggressive payment and interest terms than are permitted by law.

Indemnification

DuPage County has no authority to provide an indemnity to a vendor. As noted above, the County has only those powers conferred by the Illinois Constitution or state law or which can be necessarily inferred from those powers. While state law does require the County to indemnify its officers and employees and authorizes it to indemnify a limited number of other governmental entities, the legislature has not authorized counties to indemnify private vendors. Moreover, the Illinois Constitution requires that all expenditures of public funds be for public purposes. In an indemnity agreement, the indemnifying party agrees to be liable for the costs associated with the defense of the other party. If the indemnified party is not a public entity, then an indemnification agreement would impermissibly require an expenditure of public funds the benefit of that private party and not for the public. Finally, an indemnity contract is an extension of the public credit and an agreement to undertake a liability. Such an extension of credit requires an appropriation for that purpose sufficient to cover the obligation at the time of contract formation.

Choice of Counsel, Waiver of Defenses

Under Illinois law, the state's attorney shall "defend all actions and proceedings brought against his county." Historical and judicial precedents along with various opinions of Illinois's attorneys general, interpret this language to mean that the state's attorney is the exclusive legal representative of his county. The state's attorney will generally appoint any attorney recommended to him by an indemnifying party or its insurance carrier who meets his approval as a "special" assistant state's attorney for the purposes of the litigation. While the state's attorney must retain the right to approve outside counsel and control the litigation, he will not interfere unreasonably with the indemnifying party's attorney selection or legal strategy (or those of its insurance carrier). The County has no authority to retain or permit counsel to represent its interests nor can it contract away the duties of the state's attorney. For this reason, the County also cannot contractually waive any defenses, privileges or immunities which may be available to it in litigation.

Payment Terms

The provisions of the Local Government Prompt Payment Act, 50 ILCS 505/1 et. seq. apply to all purchases made by DuPage County. The Act provides that the County must approve or disapprove of an invoice for goods or services within 30 days of the presentation of the invoice or delivery of the goods or services — whichever is later. The County then has 30 days after approval to pay any portion of the invoice which it has not disapproved. Interest, when permitted under the Act, accrues on a monthly basis at 1%. While the County may not offer payment or interest terms which are more generous to the vendor than authorized by the Act, the parties may agree to provide an incentive for more rapid payments.

The above list is not exhaustive, but it does address the most common areas of concern during the contract negotiation phase. Accordingly, all prospective offerors are on notice that the County is without the authority to accept nor will it respond to any exceptions which purport to impose a duty on the County to indemnify a vendor, abridge the duties of the state's attorney, waive any legal privilege, defense, or immunity available to it, or obligate it to payment and interest terms other than as permitted by the Local Government Prompt Payment Act. Further all prospective offerors are on notice that any such provision in any standard form contract is unenforceable and void as a matter of law whether or not approved by the County.

Lombard Veterinary Hospital, a PPF partner, is one of the most frequently used vet clinics by program participants. There is no way for staff to predetermine the volume any one PPF partner vet will have in a given year. The requested Contract Total is based on FY24 expenditure and program usage with Lombard Veterinary Hospital.

JUSTIFICATION Summarize why this procurement is necessary and what objectives will be accomplished Lombard Veterinary Hospital is a PPF partner and actively promotes the DCAS no-cost spay/neuter program to DuPage County residents. 



ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION FOR THE ANIMAL SERVICES FUND COMPANY 1100 - ACCOUNTING UNIT 1300 \$87,750

WHEREAS, appropriations for the ANIMAL SERVICES FUND for Fiscal Year 2025 were adopted by the County Board pursuant to Ordinance FI-O-0010-24; and

WHEREAS, due to the need to upfit two transit vehicles purchased by Animal Services, there is a need for an additional appropriation in the ANIMAL SERVICES FUND - COMPANY 1100, ACCOUNTING UNIT 1300 in the amount of \$87,750 (EIGHTY-SEVEN THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY AND NO/100 DOLLARS); and

WHEREAS, there is sufficient unappropriated cash in the ANIMAL SERVICES FUND - COMPANY 1100, ACCOUNTING UNIT 1300 to support an additional appropriation of \$87,750 (EIGHTY-SEVEN THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY AND NO/100 DOLLARS); and

WHEREAS, the need to provide an additional appropriation in the amount of \$87,750 (EIGHTY-SEVEN THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY AND NO/100 DOLLARS) in the ANIMAL SERVICES FUND - COMPANY 1100, ACCOUNTING UNIT 1300 creates an emergency within the meaning of the Counties Act, Budget Division, (55 ILCS 5/6-1003).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the DuPage County Board that an additional appropriation (Attachment) in the amount of \$87,750 (EIGHTY-SEVEN THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY AND NO/100 DOLLARS) in the ANIMAL SERVICES FUND - COMPANY 1100, ACCOUNTING UNIT 1300 is hereby approved and added to the Fiscal Year 2025 Appropriation Ordinance.
