**Comment:** Three weeks ago in a phone call with the DuPage County Trails Coordinator (Sid Kenyon) he said in defense of the trees being cut down on the IPP's Elgin branch by DuPage County's DOT crews beyond the 6' no cut zone "they only cut down a couple of trees."

Now they cut down several non buckthorn trees beyond the previously agreed to no cut zone. When will the damage stop? When will the DOT use the knowledge of the arborist Jen Boyer employed by DuPage County?

With no snow in the forecast the DOT crews are being sent out to the trails. In the no snow winter of 2002 the then Chair of DuPage County Robert Schillerstrom stopped the damage being done by the DuPage County DOT crews. He then established a Trails Maintenance Committee and it was Chaired by Brook McDonald of the DuPage Conservation Foundation. We met for nearly a year and established a trail maintenance policy which he accepted and it's been followed for many years until now. Why not?

Who will step in and get the DOT crews the guidance they need to only cut buckthorn?

Lake Street Corridor Updates and Concerns

**Comment:**

Hello Dupage County Board Member,

I am a resident of unincorporated Roselle with some concerns about the area that I would like to bring to your attention. To begin, I would like to encourage more open dialog about the Lake street corridor project as well as other updates to properties along the corridor. We have a few properties just in our portion of the corridor at Lake Street and Garden ave that, in my opinion need to be dealt with and we are

not getting updated information on what is happening with these properties and what can be done to improve the area. Examples of this include the commercial property of K Plaza at 24W445 Lake Street and the residential property at 6N113 Garden Ave, Roselle, IL 6072.

K Plaza, as documented in their previous for sale listing, is to only have 30 parking spots, yet has at least 70 cars constantly parked on site (double parked in fact and blocking their dumpsters at all times, as well as parked on grass and gravel areas). This is an issue as most spots are taken up by the used car lot (looks like a junk yard), Auto Deals, leaving little to no spots for the other businesses there. Also a few of these cars are in a really bad state of disrepair with open door and/or windows that likely are housing critters. Additionally, K plaza is home to Blue House Hookah Lounge that has had a late night party, fully equipped with food, alcohol, and DJ (as depicted on their social media) every two weeks with the Dj playing very loud music and base until 2 AM (police were called out on December 2, 2023). The previous hookah lounge ran similar parties and also disposed of their burning waste in the brush of the empty lot behind the building. Are these businesses in compliance with their licenses? Do they have licenses? Who is monitoring these businesses and their practices (over filled parking lot, disposal of hookah waste, and disposal and collection of dumpsters being blocked)?

Finally, I ask what is the status of the residential property on Garden ave. The house that was there, burned down on Oct 29, 2020 and took about three years to tear it down (September 2023). Meanwhile there is still trash (abandoned boats, cars, and an RV) and other debris on the property as well as new mounds of gravel that in my understanding were not approved to be there. My question is why is this owner allowed to leave this property in such a state of disrepair and not held to the standards of the county and zoning? The property is bringing in unwanted guests (animal and human alike). The RV was inhabited by an alleged attempted murderer (he was arrested in 2023 for allegedly shooting a man). And as recently as December of 2023, an individual who was coming to the property every evening to sleep in their car (police called to investigate the suspicious vehicle only 200 feet from my home and children). Can the county please update the public on such items as they affect us closely as well as effect the Lake Street Corridor project.

I encourage you to please take a drive down Lake Street west of Springfield Drive and down Garden Avenue to see the state of these properties for yourself. These properties have all remained like this for years at this point.
