PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no in-person or online public comment.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

9/24/25 minutes – Member Childress moved to approve. Seconded by Member Evans. Motion carried.

2026 LEGISLATIVE AGENDAS

Mayor Levin discussed DMMC's legislative updates, including pensions, LGDF distributions, and modernizing public records laws. He also discussed the Governor's proposed BUILD Act legislation and the possible implications on local building and zoning authority. Mayor Levin also mentioned the proposed Conference initiative trailer bill to the NITA Act and local parking

regulations, HB 5488. DMMC is also supporting revisions to the Open Meetings Act and local hotel/motel tax use.

Member Honig provided an overview on the County's 2026 legislative agenda including: Medicaid reimbursements for mental health services, increasing affordable and missing middle housing, keeping communities safe from ICE, community safety and safe gun storage, increasing LGDF, supporting economic development, supporting efforts to eliminate food insecurity, protecting the environment with safe disposal of household hazardous waste, supporting 211 funding, and supporting the animal population. Member Honig also mentioned the County's capital improvement plan.

MUNICIPAL & COUNTY UPDATES

Committee members provided the following updates:

Childress: Importance of public works and the new memorial for victims of violence on the County's campus.

Eckhoff: His work with the Health Department to develop a safe technology usage education series.

Schwarze: The County's recent action on reducing food insecurity including the \$4.5 million dollars allocated to the Northern Illinois Food Bank and Loaves and Fishes. He also provided an update from the ETSB Committee and their planning for future radios and possible changes in Springfield.

Alexander-Basta: Bolingbrook is legally intervening in Illinois American Water's request for rate increases to the Illinois Commerce Commission. She also discussed plans to educate residents on the importance of LGDF.

Pruyn: Upcoming events, the new fire station, construction of data centers, apartment building construction, and possible changes to hotel/motel tax local use through legislation.

Hundley: Upcoming events, construction of new apartment buildings, and consolidation of water treatment facilities.

Evans: Working with the State's Attorney Office and other stakeholders to fill holes in the juvenile justice system, local police and fire departments on a possible drone pilot program, and updates from the Stormwater Committee

Levin: Announced their city manager is retiring, the construction of a new police station, and efforts to build a new performing arts center

Honig: Working with local environmental groups and schools on donating unwanted and unused food from schools to local pantries
