The undersigned AGENCY and VENDOR (the "Parties") agree to enter into this Emergency Contract (the "Contract"), consisting of the signature page and numbered sections listed below and the attachments listed and included below, which together constitute the entire Contract between the Parties concerning the subject matter of the Contract. In signing the Contract, Vendor affirms that its Certifications and Disclosures are true and accurate as of the date of Vendor's execution of the Contract. This Contract supersedes all prior proposals, contracts and understandings between the Parties concerning the subject matter of the Contract. The Parties further agree as follows:

1. DESCRIPTION OF CONTRACT:

The Illinois Department of Innovation and Technology ("DoIT" or the "State") is executing a Statewide Joint Purchase Master Contract for Data, Network, and Voice Services for use by governmental units and qualified not-for-profit agencies, as further stated herein.

Vendor acknowledges that DoIT is obligated by statute to provide for and control the procurement, retention, installation, and maintenance of telecommunications equipment or services used by the State agencies it serves, in the interest of efficiency and economy, and that this process is governed by the Department of Innovation and Technology Act, 20 ILCS 1370/1-15, 20 ILCS 1370/1-30, and 20 ILCS 1370/1-35. [Statutory changes made by P.A. 104-195, effective January 1, 2026, are noted below where appropriate.] To accomplish this statutory obligation, DoIT procures telecommunications goods and services at optimal costs and leases such goods and services back to the State agencies that DoIT serves.

- A. "Chief Procurement Officer" means the chief procurement officer appointed pursuant to 30 ILCS 500/10-20(a)(4).
- B. For purposes of this Contract, a "Governmental Unit" means DoIT or any municipal governments, community colleges, local school districts and other bodies politic, municipal corporations and similar entities, and State of Illinois government entities or elected officials—but excludes any "Transferring Agency"

[changed to "Transferred Agency" effective January 1, 2026] listed in the Department of Innovation and Technology Act, 20 ILCS 1370/1-5, or any other State agency served by DoIT.

- C. "Qualified not-for-profit agency" means any not-for-profit agency that qualifies under Section 45-35 of the Illinois Procurement Code and that either (1) acts pursuant to a board established by or controlled by a unit of local government or (2) receives grant funds from the State or from a unit of local government.

The Chief Procurement Officer for General Services makes this Contract available to Governmental units and Qualified Not-For-Profit Agencies, as stated herein. Transferring Agencies [changed to "Transferred Agencies" effective January 1, 2026] and any other State agencies served by DoIT are not allowed to purchase directly off this Contract.

Vendor agrees to extend all terms and conditions, specifications, and pricing or discounts specified in this Contract for the items in this Contract to all Governmental Units and Qualified Not-For-Profit Agencies, as specified herein. The supplies or services subject to this Contract shall be distributed or rendered directly to each Governmental Unit or Qualified Not-For-Profit Agency, as specified herein. Vendor shall bill each Governmental Unit or Qualified Not-For-Profit Agency separately for its share of the costs of the supplies or services purchased. The credit or liability of each Governmental Unit or Qualified Not-For-Profit Agency shall remain separate and distinct. Disputes between Vendor and Governmental Units and Qualified Not-For-Profit Agencies shall be resolved between the affected parties. All terms and conditions in this Contract shall apply with full force and effect to all purchase orders.

Vendor shall accept and execute orders and modification to orders from individuals authorized by the State acting on behalf of DoIT and from Governmental Units and Qualified Not-For-Profit Agencies as outlined above. The State shall provide Vendor with a list of authorized individuals. The ordering party of a Governmental Unit or Qualified Not-For-Profit Agency requesting services hereunder must sign an "Acknowledgement of Service Order" substantially in the form attached hereto as Attachment A that will specify the service term, the applicable price and any other terms and conditions that will apply to such order.

2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

Except as modified by the terms set forth herein, this Contract is on the same terms and conditions as Contract #CMT1020636/ 21-448DOIT-TELEC-P-27137, which expired on December 9, 2022, (but omitting some of its original attachments, as provided below) attached hereto as Exhibit A (the "Prior Terms"). In the event of any ambiguity, inconsistency, or conflict between terms, the following order of precedence shall apply: (1) this Contract (but excluding Attachment 1 and the Prior Terms); (2) the Prior Terms

(but excluding any original attachments); (3) Attachment 1 of this Contract; (4) any original attachments included in the Prior Terms as provided below; and (5) any additional Vendor terms referenced or incorporated by hyperlink or otherwise within (a) Attachment 1 of this Contract, or (b) the Prior Terms. For the avoidance of doubt, pricing for services shown in Attachment 1—Modern Rate Table, attached to this Contract will supersede any pricing shown in any original attachments included in the Prior Terms.

A. The new following subsection is added to Section 4.8 (“Indemnification and Liability”):

4.8.5 DATA BREACH PREVENTION, NOTICE, AND REMEDIATION: Vendor shall protect the security, storage, and integrity of the State’s data on Vendor’s networks and data storage facilities from unauthorized access. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Contract, to the extent that Vendor experiences an information breach that adversely affects the State’s data, Vendor shall promptly notify the State and will use best efforts to immediately remedy any such breach or incident, and to prevent any further breach or incident, at Vendor’s expense, in accordance with applicable privacy rights, laws, regulations, including but not limited to the Illinois Personal Information Protection Act (815 ILCS 530), if applicable to the services provided. Vendor shall reimburse the State for all costs incurred by the State in responding to, and mitigating damages caused by, any such breach or security incident, including all costs of notice and/or remediation, and restoration or replacement of such data, content, computers, systems, or networks. Prior to any request for reimbursement, the State will present to Vendor reasonable written documentation, evidencing such costs.

B. The existing Section 4.17 (“Notices”) is replaced in its entirety with the following:

4.17 NOTICES: Notices and other communications provided for herein shall be given in writing via electronic mail whenever possible. If transmission via electronic mail is not possible, then notices and other communications shall be given in writing via registered or certified mail with return receipt requested, via receipted hand delivery or via courier (UPS, Federal Express or other similar and reliable carrier). Notices shall be sent to the individuals who signed this Contract using the contact information as provided with the signatures. Each such notice shall be deemed to have been provided at the time it is received. By giving notice, either Party may change its contact information.

C. The existing Section 4.18 (“Modifications and Survival”) is replaced in its entirety with the following:

4.18. MODIFICATIONS, SURVIVAL: Amendments, modifications, and waivers must be in writing and signed by authorized representatives of the Parties. However, to the

extent this is a master Contract, no order placed against it may purport to amend the terms herein. Any provision of this Contract officially declared void, unenforceable, or against public policy, shall be ignored and the remaining provisions shall be interpreted, as far as possible, to give effect to the Parties' intent. All provisions that by their nature would be expected to survive, shall survive termination. Furthermore:

1. **Payment Obligations:** All fees, charges, and payment obligations incurred as allowed in this Contract prior to the effective date of termination of the Contract shall remain due and enforceable. In addition, for any in-scope services or products ordered subject to a fixed-term or consumption agreement term (which for example may include cloud consumption models, telecommunications circuits, Software-as-a-Service (SaaS) subscriptions, or software licenses) that extends beyond the termination or expiration of this Contract, such services and products shall continue to be provided and the associated payment obligations shall continue for the duration of the applicable ordered term.
2. **Term-Based Commitments:** Any service or product governed by a fixed-term or consumption agreement term (which for example may include cloud consumption models, telecommunications circuits, SaaS subscriptions, or software licenses) shall continue to be subject to the terms and conditions of this Contract until the end of the applicable ordered term.
3. - AVI-SPL shall coordinate with the client's IT personnel establishing WAP usage and IP addresses where a stand-alone AV LAN is utilized. Where the control system is on the client LAN, AVI-SPL shall provide a list of A/V network appliances along with their MAC addresses. The client will then provide AVI-SPL with a static IP address range for those devices.
- Careful attention should be paid to the network architecture that will be supporting the video data. An improperly configured network, or one that does not always have adequate bandwidth to support a stable conference, will have a negative impact on the conferencing experience. When installing equipment (control systems, VoIP interfaces, etc.) operating on the Customer network, coordination between client IT and the AVI-

SPL project team is critical. Please see the network information and requirements in this specification for further details.

Room Environmental Considerations

To maximize the user experience in a conferencing room, the following parameters should be observed:

- The room should have a measured ambient noise level of no more than NC35. For new spaces, the design parameters for the mechanical engineering within the room should have a target NC of 35 or less. Ambient noise includes noise from the air handling systems, mechanical systems and noises outside the building. Noise levels above this specification adversely affects the meeting environment and may degrade the overall audio quality and intelligibility of a conference call. This is especially important when ceiling microphones are utilized. If a problem is identified with ambient noise levels, AVI-SPL can work with your mechanical engineer to identify possible solutions to lower the NC rating and improve the meeting experience.
- Reverberation time (T_{60}) for typical conference rooms should be less than 0.6 seconds in the 125 - 4000 Hz octave bands to provide an optimum meeting experience and acceptable audio quality in a conference call. A significant number of hard surfaces in a room (glass, drywall or other surfaces) can adversely affect audio intelligibility and the meeting experience overall. Acoustic treatment is advised for rooms with higher T_{60} levels. If the room requires acoustically treatment, AVI-SPL can provide direction and solutions to overcome this issue and enhance the meeting experience for the participants.
- Evenly distributed lighting is important for videoconferencing applications. Lighting on the faces of the participants should be at least 40-foot candles and should be evenly distributed throughout the camera's field of view. Where the camera's field of view includes windows, recommended window treatment should be employed to provide an acceptable background for the camera to view the participants.
- When microphones are used for local voice reinforcement, the amount of available gain before feedback is dependent on the microphone's location within the room. Placement of the microphone immediately below a ceiling speaker may adversely affect the overall required audio level and cause feedback. Care should be taken to reduce the volume level of the microphone or locate the microphone(s) correctly to minimize the possibility of feedback.

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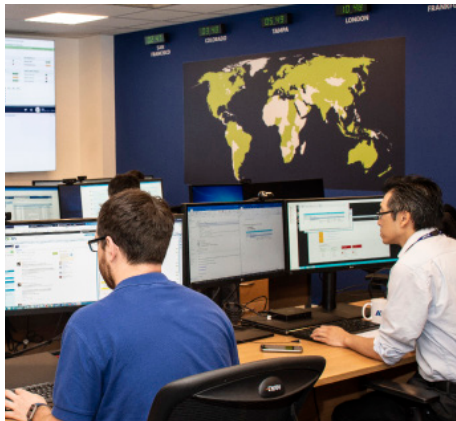

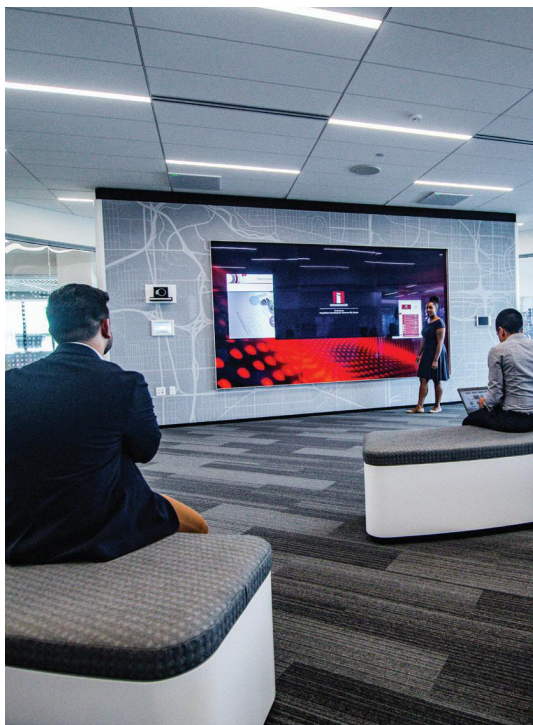

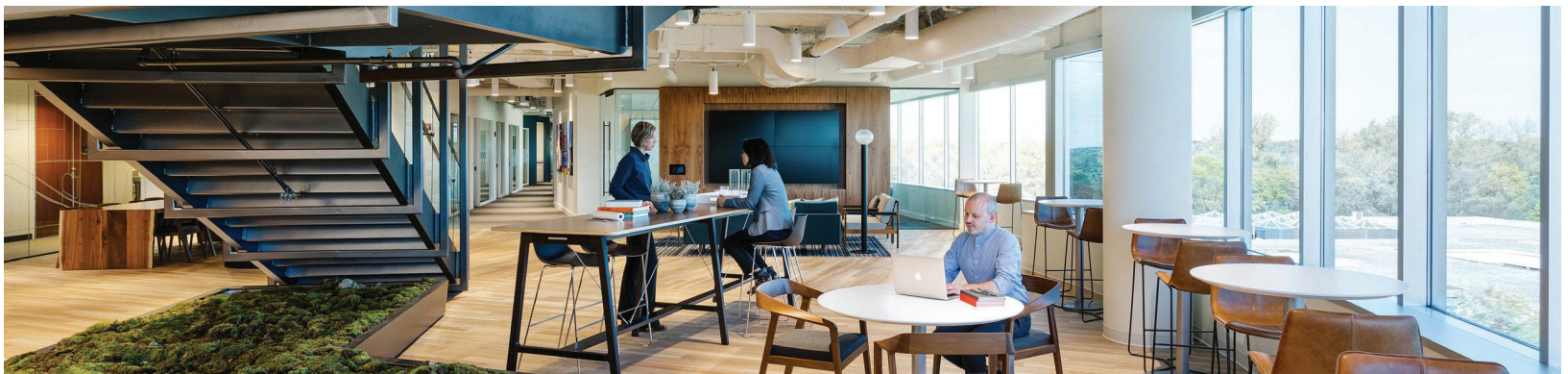

SELLER'S LIABILITY SHALL UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES EXCEED THE PURCHASE PRICE OF SUCH ITEM OF EQUIPMENT SET FORTH IN THIS AGREEMENT.**

6. **TITLE:** Title to the Equipment free and clear of all liens, claims and encumbrances of any kind shall vest in BUYER upon final payment by BUYER to SELLER of the full Sale Price required to be paid pursuant to Paragraph 3 hereof.
7. **NOTICES:** Any notice hereunder shall be in writing and shall be deemed to be given when delivered, including but not limited to overnight courier or electronic transmission or, if mailed, on the third day after mailing by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid and addressed to BUYER or SELLER at its respective address shown on the preamble to this Agreement, or to either party at such other address it has designated as its address for purposes of notice hereunder.
8. **FORUM SELECTION, CHOICE OF LAW, AND INDEMNITY:**
 - A. The venue for all disputes arising out of this contract will be exclusively in the circuit court for the Eighteenth Judicial Circuit in DuPage County, Illinois;
 - B. This contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois including all matters of construction, validity, performance and enforcement; and
 - C. BUYER shall, at all times, to the extent permitted by law, fully indemnify, hold harmless, and defend the SELLER and its officers, agents, and employees from and against any and all claims and demands, actions or suits brought against them. BUYER shall likewise be liable for the cost, fees and expenses incurred in the SELLER's defense of any such claims, actions or suits. Notwithstanding this duty to indemnify, the Parties recognize that the DuPage County State's Attorney is the exclusive legal representative of the County of DuPage and the SELLER. Nothing contained herein shall be construed as prohibiting the DuPage County State's Attorney's Office from defending the SELLER, the County, or their officials, directors, officers, agents and employees, from defending through the selection and use of their own agents, attorneys and experts, any claims, suits, demands, proceedings and actions brought against them. Indemnification shall not be deemed a waiver of the SELLER or the County of DuPage's defenses under the Illinois Local Government and Governmental Employees Tort Liability Act.
9. **MISCELLANEOUS**
 - A. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between SELLER and BUYER with respect to the sale and purchase of the Equipment on Attachment A and supersedes all prior and concurrent offers, promises, representations, negotiations, discussions and agreements that may have been made in connection with the sale of the Equipment. No representation or statement not contained herein shall be binding upon SELLER or BUYER as a warranty or otherwise unless in writing and executed by the party to be bound thereby. If BUYER does not sign this Agreement and return the signed copy of this Agreement to SELLER within sixty (60) days of the receipt of the Agreement, this Agreement may be voided at SELLER'S election.
 - B. BUYER shall not assign its rights under this Agreement unless it has obtained the prior written consent of SELLER. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure

to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and permitted assigns.

- C. This Agreement shall be governed by construed in accordance with the internal laws of the State of Illinois including all matters of construction, validity, performance and enforcement.
- D. This Agreement is subject to acceptance by SELLER at its offices referred to in the preamble and shall only become effective on the date thereof.
- E. No revision or modification of this Agreement shall be effective unless it is in writing and signed by duly authorized officers of BUYER and SELLER.
- F. The SELLER is authorized to make amendments to Attachment A to substitute radios rejected by BUYER for different radios already deemed surplus.
- G. The BUYER further agrees that any options which are integrated as part of the subscriber units including but not limited to Airtime are the responsibility of the BUYER.
- H. The BUYER understands that purchase of equipment does not entitle BUYER to access to the DuPage Emergency Dispatch Interoperable Radio System (DEDIR System). Access to the DEDIR System may be granted through a different application request.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have caused this Agreement to be executed and do each hereby warrant and represent that its signatory whose signature appears below has been and is on the date of this Agreement duly authorized by all necessary and appropriate corporate action to execute this Agreement.

If this Agreement is not executed by both parties and returned to SELLER within sixty (60) days of receipt, SELLER may terminate this Agreement without notice.
