Grant Proposal Summary: Valor 360 Food Pantry for Veterans & First Responders by Support Over Stigma

Support Over Stigma is committed to supporting our nation's veterans and first responders, recognizing their dedication and sacrifices. Despite their service, many of these individuals face significant challenges, including food and housing insecurity which adds to their mental health challenges. Most are reluctant to seek assistance from traditional food pantries, often enduring hardship in silence. To address this urgent need, our Valor 360 program proposes the creation of a dedicated food pantry tailored specifically for veterans and first responders, ensuring they have access to essential resources in an environment that helps them with these and other needs.

Statement of Need

Food insecurity among veterans and first responders is a pressing concern. Studies indicate that approximately 11.1% of working-age veterans live in food-insecure households, with 5.3% experiencing very low food security, leading to disrupted eating patterns and reduced food intake. Furthermore, veterans who served in Iraq and Afghanistan are nearly twice as likely to be food insecure compared to the general population.

Several factors contribute to this issue:

- Low Income and Employment Challenges: Transitioning from military service can present difficulties in securing stable employment, impacting financial stability.
- Physical and Mental Health Conditions: Service-related health issues can hinder the ability to maintain consistent employment, exacerbating financial and food security challenges.
- Reluctance to Seek Assistance: Many veterans and first responders are hesitant to utilize
 traditional food pantries due to stigma or a desire for self-reliance. They often prefer to
 "make do with what we got," leading them to endure hardship rather than seek help.

Project Description

Valor 360 aims to establish a dedicated food pantry designed to serve veterans and first responders with dignity and respect. The pantry will provide:

- Nutritious Food Supplies: A selection of non-perishable and perishable items to meet diverse dietary needs.
- Hygiene and Personal Care Products: Essential items including toothpaste, body wash, laundry detergent, fabric softener, toilet bowl cleaner, diapers, feminine hygiene products, toilet paper, and paper towels.











Budget

The initial setup and procurement of supplies are estimated as follows:

Refrigerator: \$1,500

Freezer: \$1,500

Heavy-Duty Shelving: \$200

Pushcart: \$75

Initial Stock of Food and Hygiene Items: \$6,725

Total Estimated Cost: \$10,000

Following the initial setup, the pantry will be sustained through community donations and partnerships, ensuring ongoing support for our veterans and first responders.

Conclusion

By establishing this dedicated food pantry, Valor 360 seeks to address the crucial issue of food insecurity among veterans and first responders in a manner that respects their service and acknowledges their unique challenges. This initiative will provide immediate relief and foster a supportive community, encouraging individuals to seek assistance without stigma.
