A GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF DUPAGE AND TEEN PARENT CONNECTION

WHEREAS, the County of DuPage ("County") is a body corporate and politic; and

WHEREAS, TEEN PARENT CONNECTION ("Agency") is a 501(c)(3) organization created under the Internal Revenue Code, and

WHEREAS, the County has established the Member Initiative Program which permits members of the County Board to advance items which benefit their district and assigns certain amounts of public funds for those purposes; and

WHEREAS, the County's funding for each Agency is not a donation and must be used to perform certain services or functions within the County's statutory authority to perform; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Agency are hereafter sometimes referred to as the "Party" and collectively referred to herein as "the Parties"; and

WHEREAS, the Parties have prepared this Agreement to govern the distribution of the grant funds identified above.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, the Parties hereby agree as follows:


- 1. **Purpose of the Agreement**. The Purpose of this Agreement is to define the project for which grant funds are to be used and provide funding for eligible expenses.
- 2. **Recitals**. The recitals to this Agreement are incorporated as though set forth fully herein.
- 3. **Term.** This Agreement shall remain in effect through November 30, 2025. Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 of this Agreement shall remain in effect indefinitely and shall survive the termination of this Agreement. Funds shall be expended prior to November 30, 2025.
- 4. **Project Description.** Agency shall receive seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) from the County. Agency shall undertake the following project or activities described in the Proposal attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- 5. **Termination, Breach**. This Agreement may be terminated upon thirty (30) days' notice to the other Party with the written consent of the other Party. All terms of this Agreement shall be considered material terms and therefore all breaches shall be deemed material breaches. In the event of a breach of this Agreement by any Party, the non-breaching Party shall provide the breaching Party with written notice of the breach and shall provide a period of not less than thirty (30) days to cure said breach.
- 6. **Venue, Applicable Law**. The exclusive venue for disputes arising from this Agreement shall be the 18th Judicial Circuit Court, sitting in Wheaton, Illinois. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois.
- 7. **Payment**. The County agrees to pay the Agency seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00). Payment is contingent upon: (1) compliance with County rules and regulations; (2) Accounts Payable review by Finance Staff and County Audit Staff including providing

sufficient invoicing and proof of purchase; and (3) completion of a fully executed Agreement. Payments shall be made in the form of reimbursement and upon invoice from Agency. Payments for eligible expenses authorized under this Agreement shall be made within thirty (30) days of receipt of completed invoices and proof of purchase. All funds shall be expended not later than November 30, 2025.

- 8. **Assignment.** Neither Party shall assign performance under this Agreement, nor shall either Party transfer any right or obligation under this Agreement without the express written approval of the County.
- 9. **Amendment.** Any amendment to the terms of this Agreement must be in writing and will not by effective until it has been executed and approved by the same Parties who approved and executed the original Agreement or their successors in office.
- 10. **Waiver.** If the County fails to enforce any provision of this Agreement, that failure does not waive said provision or the County's right to enforce it.
- 11. **Sole Agreement.** This Agreement contains all negotiations between the County and Agency. No other understanding regarding this grant Agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either Party.
- 12. **Liability**. The Agency agrees to indemnify, save, and hold the County, its officers, agents and employees, harmless from any claims or causes of action, including attorney's fees incurred by the County, arising from the performance of this Agreement by the Agency, its officers, agents or employees. This clause will not be construed to bar any legal remedies the Agency may have for the County's failure to fulfill any of the County's obligations under this Agreement. Notwithstanding any provisions of this Agreement to the contrary, indemnification under Section 12 of this Agreement shall be limited to the Agency's allocation, less any amount unspent.

I am writing to request a County Board Member Initiative Grant to support the work and mission of Teen Parent Connection.

This organization is dedicated to empowering young parents and their children by providing essential education, resources, and support. Our mission is to equip young families with the tools they need for a healthy and successful future. We offer a variety of services, including parenting education, support groups, and vital programs like our Car Seat Safety Education initiative. Located in District 4 (Glen Ellyn), we have been a steadfast presence in the community. As we celebrate 40 years of service, we are more committed than ever to addressing these challenges and ensuring young families in our community have the support and resources they need for a brighter future.

We are requesting \$7,000 in funding that will help fund several critical initiatives that will directly benefit the families we serve.

Funding Breakdown:

1. Basics Insights Program Enrollment - \$1,000

We aim to enroll our families in the Basics Insights program offered by the DuPage County Health Department. This program provides parents with text messages customized based on their child's birth date, offering valuable information about developmental milestones and ways to support their child's healthy growth. Developed by a Harvard professor, Boston Basics is the foundation of this program, ensuring that the information provided is research-based and highly beneficial.

• **Impact:** By participating in this program, parents will be better equipped to support their children's development, leading to improved educational and health outcomes.

2. Diapers for Parents Pantry - \$2,500

We plan to purchase larger size diapers for our Parents Pantry, ensuring that families have access to essential supplies for their growing children. Diapers cannot be purchased with LINK cards – leaving families to struggle with the added financial burden of buying these essential items out-of-pocket.

• **Impact:** Access to diapers helps alleviate financial stress for young parents, allowing them to focus on other critical needs and providing a healthier environment for their children.

3. iPads for Home Visitors - \$2,500

These funds will allow us to purchase iPads for our home visitors to use in the field. This technology will enable them to connect to the internet to access our participant database while in the field – as

well as the ability to assist families with applications for jobs, FAFSA, bill payments, school lunch programs, health care accounts, and more.

• Impact: With iPads, our home visitors can provide more efficient and effective support, helping families access vital resources and services that can improve their quality of life.

4. Car Seats for Young Families - \$1000

Teen Parent Connection's Car Seat Safety Education program has grown to a team of seven certified technicians. The program provides essential car seat education, safety checks, and installations, ensuring that parents who cannot afford a new car seat receive one after completing a passenger safety program. This initiative is crucial as nearly 49% of child safety seats are installed or used improperly. The program includes educational sessions, safety fairs, and partnerships with local police, with materials available in both English and Spanish.

• Impact: Teen Parent Connection is dedicated to ensuring the safety of children in DuPage County by providing expert car seat education and installations, significantly enhancing parents' confidence and knowledge.



With TPC's Young Parent Support and Therapy Groups, she found community amongst other young moms who she can relate to and learn from. "It's a little family." Her baby, Gabriela, loves to tag along group sessions and socialize with the other young children. Baby Gabriela is happily growing every day as she approaches her first birthday. She likes to channel her musically creative side by playing with toy drums, singing with Miss Rachel, and dancing to Reggaeton music.

Adriana says that Teen Parent Connection's staff and programs played a large role in encouraging her to get out of her comfort zone and gain confidence. She is extremely grateful for all the resources received and recommends TPC to other young parents. "With the right support and the right people, you're going to be fine."


Teen Parent Connection offers a continuum of programs that serve the community through education, empowerment, and support for teenagers and teenage parents.

Doula

Our Doula program supports pregnant teens by providing continuous physical, emotional, and informational assistance before, during, and after childbirth. Doulas offer personalized, one-to-one care to ensure each young parent receives individualized support. Our services include childbirth education classes, home visits, and tailored support to empower and prepare young parents for their new role.



Healthy Families

The Healthy Families program provides young parents with support by meeting them where they're at—right in their own home. Home visits offer personalized assistance, helping parents build confidence and develop essential protective factors. These include understanding child development, fostering strong bonds between parent and child, and creating a safe home environment, all of which contribute to the overall well-being and resilience of the family.

Father Engagement

TPC's Father Engagement program supports young fathers as parents, providers, caregivers, and nurturers. education, we aim to empower students with the knowledge and skills to make informed decisions about their health and future.
