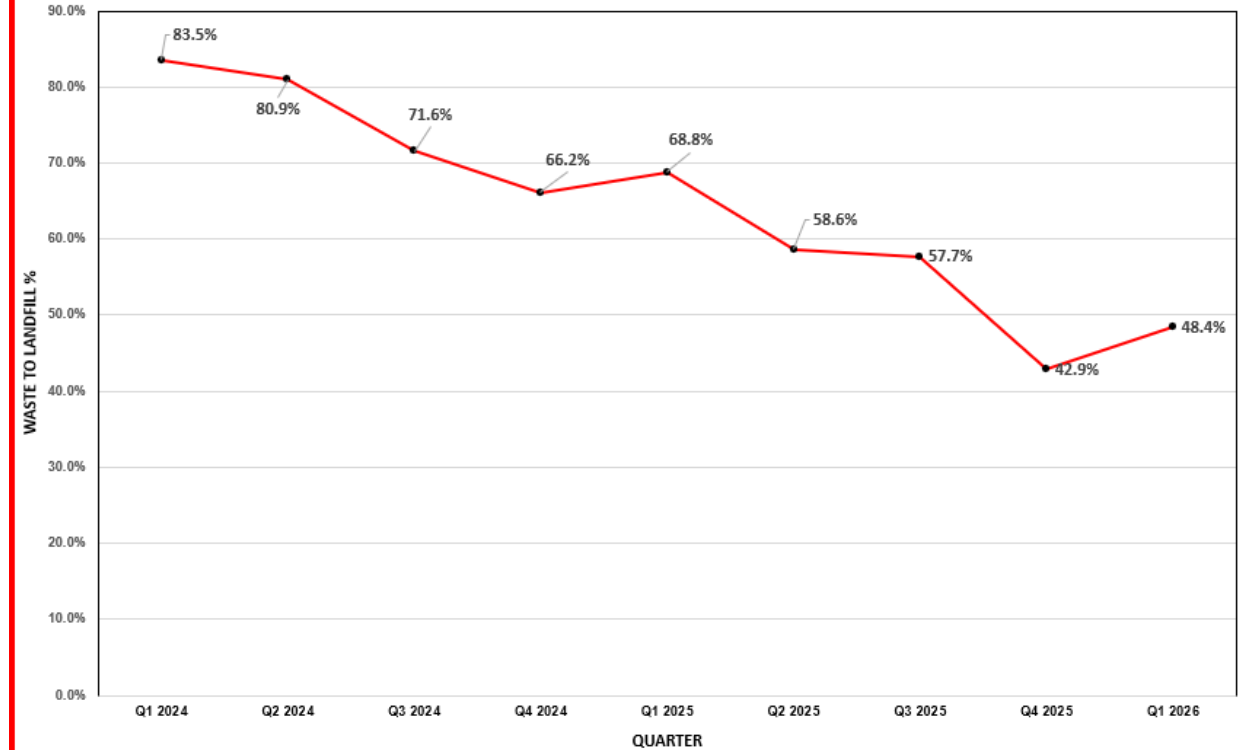

- Stay Informed: Keep up-to-date with the latest information on climate change and share your knowledge.

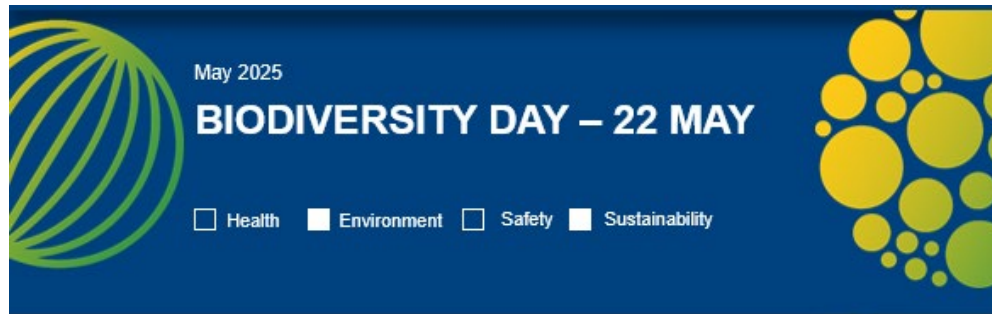
