A GRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF DUPAGE AND LOAVES AND FISHES

WHEREAS, the County of DuPage ("County") is a body corporate and politic; and

WHEREAS, LOAVES AND FISHES ("Agency") is a 501(c)(3) organization created under the Internal Revenue Code, and

WHEREAS, the County has established the Member Initiative Program which permits members of the County Board to advance items which benefit their district and assigns certain amounts of public funds for those purposes; and

WHEREAS, the County's funding for each Agency is not a donation and must be used to perform certain services or functions within the County's statutory authority to perform; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Agency are hereafter sometimes referred to as the "Party" and collectively referred to herein as "the Parties"; and

WHEREAS, the Parties have prepared this Agreement to govern the distribution of the grant funds identified above.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. **Purpose of the Agreement**. The Purpose of this Agreement is to define the project for which grant funds are to be used and provide funding for eligible expenses.
- 2. Recitals. The recitals to this Agreement are incorporated as though set forth fully herein.
- 3. **Term.** This Agreement shall remain in effect through November 30, 2025. Sections 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 of this Agreement shall remain in effect indefinitely and shall survive the termination of this Agreement. Funds shall be expended prior to November 30, 2025.
- 4. **Project Description.** Agency shall receive fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00) from the County. Agency shall undertake the following project or activities described in the Proposal attached hereto as Exhibit A.
- 5. **Termination, Breach**. This Agreement may be terminated upon thirty (30) days' notice to the other Party with the written consent of the other Party. All terms of this Agreement shall be considered material terms and therefore all breaches shall be deemed material breaches. In the event of a breach of this Agreement by any Party, the non-breaching Party shall provide the breaching Party with written notice of the breach and shall provide a period of not less than thirty (30) days to cure said breach.
- 6. **Venue, Applicable Law**. The exclusive venue for disputes arising from this Agreement shall be the 18th Judicial Circuit Court, sitting in Wheaton, Illinois. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Illinois.
- 7. **Payment**. The County agrees to pay the Agency fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00). Payment is contingent upon: (1) compliance with County rules and regulations; (2) Accounts Payable review by Finance Staff and County Audit Staff including providing sufficient invoicing and proof of purchase; and (3) completion of a fully executed Agreement. Payments shall be made in the form of reimbursement and upon invoice from

- Agency. Payments for eligible expenses authorized under this Agreement shall be made within thirty (30) days of receipt of completed invoices and proof of purchase. All funds shall be expended not later than November 30, 2025.
- 8. **Assignment.** Neither Party shall assign performance under this Agreement, nor shall either Party transfer any right or obligation under this Agreement without the express written approval of the County.
- 9. Amendment. Any amendment to the terms of this Agreement must be in writing and will not by effective until it has been executed and approved by the same Parties who approved and executed the original Agreement or their successors in office.
- 10. Waiver. If the County fails to enforce any provision of this Agreement, that failure does not waive said provision or the County's right to enforce it.
- 11. **Sole Agreement**. This Agreement contains all negotiations between the County and Agency. No other understanding regarding this grant Agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either Party.
- 12. **Liability**. The Agency agrees to indemnify, save, and hold the County, its officers, agents and employees, harmless from any claims or causes of action, including attorney's fees incurred by the County, arising from the performance of this Agreement by the Agency, its officers, agents or employees. This clause will not be construed to bar any legal remedies the Agency may have for the County's failure to fulfill any of the County's obligations under this Agreement. Notwithstanding any provisions of this Agreement to the contrary, indemnification under Section 12 of this Agreement shall be limited to the Agency's allocation, less any amount unspent.
- 13. Permits. The Agency shall comply with all local, county, state and federal requirements now in force, or which may hereafter be in force, pertaining to the project which forms the basis for this grant. Nothing in this agreement shall be found to act as an approval of any specific works which require separate county permitting approval, such as stormwater or building permits.

Desired Outcomes	Loaves & Fishes rescues food daily from local grocery stores through our Food Rescue Program, ensuring families in need have access to healthy, nutritious food. While the majority of rescued food is high quality, a small portion must be discarded due to poor condition or compromised packaging, making it unsuitable for distribution. Currently, this food must be hauled away and disposed of in landfills at our expense. This project will allow us to compost that inedible food on-site, diverting over 300,000 pounds of waste from landfills each year. The compost will be picked up and used by collaborators such as The Conservation Foundation and the Naperville Park District to support local gardens and green spaces. In addition to reducing environmental impact, composting on-site will lower our waste hauling costs, allowing us to reinvest those funds into food distribution and client support. This project strengthens our operational sustainability while deepening collaboration across the community.

The request is for \$15,000 toward our "Feed the Earth, Feed the Community" initiative. I've provided more context below. Please don't hesitate to reach out with any questions and thanks again!

Feed the Earth, Feed the Community

At Loaves & Fishes Community Services, we believe that nourishing people and caring for the planet go hand-in-hand. That's why we launched **Feed the Earth, Feed the Community**—a community-driven fundraising campaign to support our new composting initiative. This project brings food full circle, from farm to grocer to pantry—and back to the soil.

An industrial-size composter is slated to be installed by the end of 2026 at our Aurora Food Distribution Hub, located at 580 Exchange Court in DuPage County. This investment supports our ability to serve 10,000+ people each week while aligning with long-term environmental sustainability goals.

Here's how it works:

- On an average food distribution day, Loaves & Fishes provides 20 tons of food to our clients.
- Approximately 35% of the food we distribute is rescued from generous local grocery partners.
- While the majority of that food goes directly to the families we serve, some items aren't suitable for distribution—totaling more than 300,000 pounds of food waste annually.
- Instead of sending that food waste to landfills, we will process it on-site with our own commercial composter.
- With this new system, inedible rescued food will be converted into rich, nutritious compost. That
 compost will then be shared with local community partners, including The Conservation
 Foundation, which grows fresh produce that returns to Loaves & Fishes for distribution—closing
 the loop in the most sustainable way.

This project strengthens our food recovery efforts, supports sustainability, and reinforces our commitment to building a healthier, more resilient regional food system. We appreciate the DuPage County Board's consideration and would welcome the opportunity to discuss this project further.
