There was a discussion regarding the State of Illinois HazConnect licensed user limits of 50 per County. Chief Mansfield expressed that not enough information is provided to first responders when going into Tier 2 hazards and ACDC has only been able to use 11 licenses for dispatchers to access HazConnect. There is a need for more licenses. Member Eckhoff asked if it was feasible to go door to door to inspect possible “hazard” containing locations. It is not required by law to report under a certain amount. Member Craig Dieckman recommends that Mansfield speak to ETSB regarding this matter. Contact will be made with the State of Illinois to determine if the access to HazConnect regulations can allow for agency-wide logins.
