Summary Report on the Small Nonprofit Grant Program, Round 1 Reporting through January 10, 2025

BACKGROUND

In fiscal year 2023, the DuPage County Board ("Board") created the Small Nonprofit Grant Program ("Program"). This Program was funded through American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA") interest income, and targeted small nonprofits that did not receive funds through either ARPA or its predecessor program, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act ("CARES").

The Board originally appropriated Round 1 of the Program in March of 2023 for \$1,050,000. Based on review of applications, the Board subsequently approved individual agreements totaling \$653,993 in August of 2023.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Program funding of all approved agreements was prepaid. Each Program agreement requires financial reporting, including proof of payment/audit support for all expenses. Such documentation of expenses is necessary because unspent funds are required to be returned.

Additionally, agreements require performance metric reporting. Nonprofit agencies worked with the State's Attorney's Office to establish performance metrics in connection with developing the agreements.

REPORTING RESULTS

The financial reporting deadline for all agreements was 12/31/2024. As of 01/10/2025, 23 out of 37 (62%) agencies have submitted part or all of required yearend reporting. The ARPA Team has emailed all noncompliant recipients attempting to collect this information. For those that have completed the reporting requirement, the ARPA Team has compiled the following information.
